Rules

All matches in this competition will be carried out in accordance with the SFC Sporting Rifle rules. Sporting Rifle rule books and ISSF General and Technical rule books are available from the Shooting Federation of Canada.

Length of Range

Matches must be fired on 20 yard ranges, using only the 12 bull target #135. Targets will **not** be supplied, but are available from the Shooting Federation of Canada. Photocopies are not permitted.

Classification

There are four (4) classes: Master, Expert, Sharpshooter and Marksman in all Sporting Rifle events. Any shooter holding a current SFC classification will be placed in their class. Any shooter **not** having a valid classification will be placed in the Temporary Expert class. These classifications will not be official recognized classifications

Class Awards

Will be based on the number of entries in each event.
This applies to all Classes, and in all events.

Two or three entries: first place only
Four entries: first and second places
More than four entries: first, second and third

Junior Shooters

May shoot in regular Class events, in addition to, or in place of, the Junior events. Only the desired matches listed on the entry form, and the appropriate fees paid, are all that is required. Junior events do not run concurrent with the regular Class events. They must be fired separately. To qualify as a Junior, a shooter must not have reached his/her 19th birthday on the May 31st 2016.

Matches for Club Teams

1. There is no restriction on classification.
2. There will be separate matches for prone and 3-position teams.
3. A club may enter any number of teams in each category without having to pay the administration fee. Individuals may shoot on only one prone team and/or one 3-position team.
4. A team will consist of four (4) shooters. It is not necessary to identify team members when making the initial entry, but once a shooter has begun a set of targets, no substitutes will be allowed
5. Courses of fire:

Prone...	60 shots (6 targets) per team member	
3-Position...	20 shots (2 targets) per team member	- Prone
	20 shots (2 targets) per team member	- Kneeling
	20 shots (2 targets) per team member	- Standing

ISSF Rifle

Rules: All matches in this competition will be carried out in accordance with ISSF Rules. General and technical rule book as well as targets are available from the Shooting Federation of Canada.

Targets: Securing the proper targets and competing on a range of the correct length is your responsibility. You or anyone else may score your targets (do not use a plug gauge). Targets used in this program are:

20 yd. ranges... SFC #134

Classification: There are four (4) classes: Master, Expert, Sharpshooter and Marksman in all events. Any shooter holding a current SFC classification will be placed in their class. Any shooter **not** having a valid classification will be placed in the Temporary Expert class. A junior's score may be classed as Marksman at the Chairman's discretion. These classifications will not be official recognized classifications

Class Awards: To be based on the number of entries in each event.

Two or three entries: first place only
Four entries: first and second places
More than four entries: first, second and third

Junior Shooters: May shoot in regular class events, in addition to, or in place of, the junior events. Only the desired matches listed on the entry form, and the appropriate fees paid, is all that is required. To qualify as a Junior, a shooter must not have reached his/her 19th birthday on May 31st, 2016.

Matches for Club Teams:

1. There is no restriction on classification.
2. There will be separate matches for prone and 3-position teams.
3. A club may enter any number of teams in each category without having to pay the administration fee. Individuals may shoot on only one prone team and/or one 3-position team.
4. A team will consist of four (4) shooters. It is not necessary to identify team members when making the initial entry, but once a shooter has begun a set of targets, no substitutes will be allowed.
5. Courses of fire:
 - Prone... Sixty (60) shots per team member
 - 3-Position... Twenty (20) shots per team member - Prone
 - Twenty (20) shots per team member - Standing
 - Twenty (20) shots per team member - Kneeling
6. ISSF Match Rifle rules apply.

All matches in this competition will be carried out in accordance with the SFC Hunting Rifle rules. Hunting/Sporting Rifle rule books Shooting Federation of Canada.

Length of Range

Matches must be fired on 20 yard ranges, using only the 12 bull target #135. Targets will **not** be supplied, but are available from the Shooting Federation of Canada. Photocopies are not permitted..

Classification

There are four (4) classes: Master, Expert, Sharpshooter and Marksman in all Hunting Rifle events. Any shooter holding a current SFC classification will be placed in their class. Any shooter **not** having a valid classification will be placed in the Temporary Expert class. These classifications will not be official recognized classifications.

Class Awards

Will be based on the number of entries in each event.

Two or three entries: first place only
Four entries: first and second places
More than four entries: first, second and third

Junior Shooters

May shoot in regular Class events, in addition to, or in place of, the Junior events. Only the desired matches listed on the entry form, and the appropriate fees paid, are all that is required. Junior events do not run concurrent with the regular Class events. They must be fired separately. To qualify as a Junior, a shooter must not have reached his/her 19th birthday on May 31st, 2016.
